CIARI- HanGreens: the green curtains of culantro (Burmese coriander)

Burmese coriander is a popular herb in the Andaman Islands and North Eastern states of India. Apart from the traditional areas, this herb is gaining popularity in other parts of the country. Generally, this herb is sold at premium prices in city markets. Many people in urban areas try to cultivate this herb in small pots to get produce for home consumption. To promote its cultivation in the urban households with limited spaces, a novel hanging structure has been developed and is being popularized in the islands. The developed structure (CIARI- HanGreens) is a hanging model and hence occupies limited space. It could be hung in the balconies and terraces. When used in urban homes, it not only provides produce for daily consumption but also gives aesthetic appeal to the area. Grower can get a good cultivation experience in small premise. Based on space available and family requirement, structure size could be customized and hence, it is user-friendly.



It could also be used as green curtains for beautification of areas including government and private establishments, tourist spots, hotels etc. It requires no major maintenance. With limited investment, user can accommodate more number of plants than the conventional pots and hence, get manifold higher produce.

Benefit: CIARI-HanGreens could be a beautiful hanging curtain of Burmese coriander for your home and commercial establishments. It'll give produce for daily consumption to urban homes, while serving as a unit of attraction in landscaping.
