Agromet bulletin for farmers

PORT BLAIR, AUG 03 - The Central Inland Agricultural Research Institute has released the agromet bulletin for farmers for the period from Aug 03-Aug 08. In the bulletin, CIARI forecast cloudy weather with moderate rainfall in the next five days in Andaman and Nicobar Islands. The maximum temperature will be 30.5 to 31.4°C with minimum temperature of 23.7 to 25.8°C, whereas the maximum and minimum relative humidity is expected to be in the range of 79 to 82% and 76 to 81%, respectively in Andaman and Nicobar Islands. Wind speed of 25.9 to 37.8 kmph is expected from South Westery direction.

In South Andaman (Blocks: Prothapan, Little Andaman and Ferrargunj), farmers have been advised to spray panchagavya 2% solution for vegetables to improve flowering and fruiting, do manure application and earthing up in vegetables as weather likely to be conducive, clean the crown of coconut tree and garden to avoid attack of beetles, take up breeding of carps by using hormones during rainy days and prepare nursery ponds for stocking spawns, use disinfectant (Phenyl/Dettol) regularly in the shed for cleaning the floor and in case of salivation in cattle strictly segregate from the other animals and follow the treatment.

Farmers in North and Middle Andaman (Blocks: Rangat, Mayabunder and Diglipur) have been advised to spray panchagavya 2% solution for vegetables to improve flowering and fruiting during rain free days, do manure application and earthing up in vegetables as weather likely to be conducive, after cleaning the coconut tree and garden, use sesbania around the coconut tree as green manure, take up breeding of carps by using hormones during rainy days and prepare nursery ponds for stocking spawns and use disinfectant (Phenyl/Dettol) regularly in the shed for cleaning the floor and in case of salivation in cattle strictly segregate from the other animals and follow the treatment.

In Nicobar (Blocks: Nan-Cowrie, Car-Nicobar and Campbell-Bay), farmers have been advised to spray panchagavya 2% solution for vegetables to improve flowering and fruiting during rain free days, do manure application and earthing up in vegetables as weather likely to be conducive, after cleaning the coconut tree and garden, use sesbania around the coconut tree as green manure, take up breeding of carps by using hormones during rainy days and prepare nursery ponds for stocking spawns, use disinfectant (Phenyl/Dettol) regularly in the shed for cleaning the floor and in case of salivation in cattle strictly segregate from the other animals and follow the treatment.
