Port Blair, July 14: Under a 100-day action plan, a 5-day skill development training program on "Harvesting Diversity: Coconut-based Intercropping with Spices and Tuber Crops" began on July 10, 2024, at the Community Hall, Tapoiming Village. Mrs. Jyoti Kumari, IAS, Deputy Commissioner of Nicobar, inaugurated the program and praised the efforts of farmers such as Mr. Patrick, Mr. Suman, Mr. Manish, and Mr. Jaan Mohammed for their contributions to advancing intensive agricultural farming in Nicobar. Mrs. Kumari spoke about the potential of agricultural diversification and sustainable practices. She highlighted the profitability of intercropping spices and tubers in coconut farms.Mr. Simon William, second captain of Tapoiming Village, attended as the guest of honor. Dr. Santosh Kumar, Head of KVK Nicobar, welcomed participants and emphasized the program's significance.
