ICAR-KVK conducts training on "Use of Women Friendly Agricultural Implements" at Dharmapur, Shivapuram GP

The training was inaugurated by Shri. VenkateswaraRao, Pradhan, Shivapuram Gram Panchayatalong with PRI members Shri.B. Vijayan Nairand Shri. Jobi.
