ICAR-KVK conducts 'Educational Exposure visit for students of JNV, Panchwati, GSSS, Sabari



SRI VIJAYA PURAM, DEC 27/-/ ICAR-KVK N&M Andaman organized an educational exposure visit for students of JNV Panchwati and Government Senior Secondary School Sabari Junction Rangat, N&M Andaman to the KVK on 23rd December, 2024. A total of 96 students accompanied by 6 teachers visited the KVK. The visit aimed to provide students with insights

into the functioning, structure, and contributions of the KVK to local agriculture and rural development.

The exposure visit commenced with a guided tour of the KVK premises. Shri Yatharth Sharma introduced students to the Processing Unit, which is instrumental in training rural women to create innovative value-added products using
