ICAR-CIARI conducts training on freshwater ornamental fish culture for Nicobarese youth

PORT BLAIR, FEB 27/-/ ICAR-Central Island Agricultural Research Institute (CIARI) for the first time conducted skill development training on 'Freshwater Ornamental Fish Culture for Entrepreneurship Development for Nicobarese Youth" at ICAR-CIARI, Garacharma, on February 23-25, 2024. The training was conducted under the Schedule Tribe Component in association with NABARD, Port Blair, and DST, New Delhiunder the chairmanship of Dr. E. B. Chakurkar, Director, ICAR-CIARI, Port Blair.

During the three-day, the participants were trained on
