Training program 'Vermicomposting and its significance in sustainable agriculture' at Car Nicobar

NICOBAR, OCT 23/-/ICAR-KVK CIARI Nicobar organized a five-day training program on "Vermicomposting and its Importance in Sustainable Agriculture" at Perka, Car Nicobar, under the TSP initiative. The inaugural ceremony was graced by Shri Paul David, the first captain of Perka village, who served as the chief guest. Shri Paul David emphasized the importance of organic farming practices and their long-term impact on the Nicobar region.
